Rene graduated from Dobson High School, attended Maricopa Community College, and went on to graduate with a B.S. in Nuclear Engineering from the University of Arizona.

Rene earned a Commission through the Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) for the U.S. Navy in 1995 and served as a Cryptologic Naval Officer stationed at Ft. Meade, Maryland. He later worked with Navy Special Operations. Rene is a third-generation Navy veteran, with his father serving in Vietnam, and his maternal grandfather serving in WWII.

Rene took up an interest in politics in junior high school, when his father took him out to knock on doors for a Phoenix mayoral race. After serving on the Chandler Parks and Recreation Committee, he was elected to the City Council in 2014. He was re-elected in 2018 and served twice as Vice Mayor of Chandler.
